# Principal's Thoughts

I love our Schoolwide Learning Expectation this week: A conscientious individual in a diverse society who is able to demonstrate self-discipline. This concept is definitely an important life skill but sometimes difficult to do especially living while in a world of so many people with such a variety of personalities. In our little world of St. Agnes School, we find many of our children are struggling to self-regulate. To address this need we have over the last couple of years, implemented Zones of Regulation schoolwide and grade level social emotional learning (SEL) programs, to assist our children. We use the Kimochis curriculum in preschool-first grade to help students identify and understand their emotions using the Kimochis characters. The children are encouraged to recognize their emotions and peacefully communicate those feelings to others. Students in grades 2-5 learn about how the brain works, how to manage and control their emotions while discovering strategies to build healthy relationships through lessons in the Changemakers program. The junior high students practice mindfulness strategies, journal writing, scripture and lessons about brain development to find ways to manage stress and peer relationships in a healthy, positive manner.

The above-mentioned curriculum lends itself beautifully to the Zones of Regulation program which gives visual cues/color coding and vocabulary to the various emotions children experience throughout the day. This common language schoolwide, helps the students further communicate their needs so the various tools introduced to them in this program, to manage their emotions, can be utilized. This user friendly language can be easily used at home and offers a nice bridge between school and home. As you know, each morning we pray together as a school community and recite our PeaceBuilder Pledge. This sets the tone for the day and reinforces the expectations of how we should conduct ourselves. By using this daily routine in addition to the vocabulary and strategies learned in these various programs, it is our goal that our students will have the necessary tools to manage their emotions and relationships each day!
