The Catholic Church designates the month of October as "Respect for Life Month." We are invited to remember that we are created in God's image and therefore we should take this time to pray (by reciting the Rosary) and to reflect on how we treat ourselves and others. The Feast of St. Francis of Assisi is this Friday, October 4th. On this day we are reminded that our Pope chose to name himself after St. Francis so he could be guided and inspired by him.
