Principal's Thoughts Feast of St. Agnes

The 60th Jubilee of our parish offers us the opportunity to have many special events, activities and masses as we reflect on our past and look toward the future. This Sunday, we will gather together as a parish community at one mass to celebrate the Feast of St. Agnes, our patron saint. The 10am Mass will be extra special; St. Agnes will be represented by Aurelia Gibson and she will be escorted in by our girl scout troop. A special presentation of symbols will also take place. I hope you will attend.

Saint Agnes was a beautiful young girl and a member of Roman nobility. Many men wanted to marry her but she refused them because of her love and devotion to God! At the age of 12 or 13 she was put to death for her final refusal to marry the Governor's son.

Her name is associated with the Latin word for "lamb" (agnus.) Her image is often depicted in art accompanied by a lamb to symbolize her innocence and purity. Traditionally on her feast day two lambs are brought to the Pope to be blessed. On Holy Thursday the wool from these lambs is gathered and woven into the pallium (a circular band worn around the neck as part of the liturgical vestments) given to a new Archbishop.

St. Agnes is the patron saint of young girls, including the Girl Scouts. In 1858 The Congregation of the Sisters of St. Agnes was founded. These devoted ladies dedicate their lives to promote justice and build community for the poor throughout the United States and Latin America. Today we honor St. Agnes' steadfast love for God and believe she is the perfect role model for our St. Agnes girls!
