Principal's Thoughts

The Jubilee Year of Hope has begun! Many celebrations and pilgrimages will take place in Rome this year, here is a link to the official website in case you are planning a trip or want to keep updated: https://www.iubilaeum2025.va/en.html.

A beautiful logo has been designed and is attached below. Four figures were chosen to represent each end of the world, symbolizing all of humanity. They embrace each other to show solidarity and connection among all people. The lead figure holds the cross, a sign of our faith which also represents hope. There are waves under the figures, symbolizing the fact that life does not always go smoothly and often the circumstances of daily life and events in the world require a greater call to hope.

The lower part of the cross is elongated and turns into the shape of an anchor. The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency situations to stabilize the ship during storms. This image further illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking but rather as something communal, leading one closer to the cross. Notice that the cross bends down towards the figures, to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. Finally, at the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year: Peregrinantes in Spem (Pilgrims in hope).
